Mentors & Clients

We currently have 22 mentors and 31 clients. There is a constant cycle of everyone involved, so it's really important we find more volunteers to come forward and take part in our training to see if mentoring is something they could take on. It's a balance of natural ability and training to produce good mentors, and of course we also need different types of people to match with our different types of clients.



Clients can sign up to have a mentor, but they need to know about our services. We are trying to increase our presence in the prisons and ensure that the relevant staff are advertising our services.

> Please pray for our mentors, they are special people. The role takes up not only time but mental and emotional energy too. Help them find time to continue receiving support and training as they carry out such an important role in clients' lives.

Pray for our clients and those considering signing up. It's a big thing to admit that you need help. Pray they can learn to trust the right people and to take responsibility for their choices.



Funding

We have received funding from several areas over the last few months and this will help us to operate over the next year: £8k Allen Lane Foundation over 2 years, £3k Alan Boswell Group and just under £20k from the Postcode Places Trust, part of the Postcode Lottery. We are currently looking for funding to employ another Mentor Co-ordinator as our work expands. Looking for future funding and different sources is a constant for our staff, and we never take for granted those smaller organisations who help fund raise for us. Recently St Andrews Church in Eaton and the Cringleford singers held a fundraising event for us, for which we are extremely thankful. If you know of anywhere you are involved with that could advertise what we do and take a collection, that would be great!

Drop-in Support

We are looking to increase and strengthen our team of volunteers to support clients when they 'Drop-in' to see us at St Stephen's Church for advice or with practical needs. We are now recording what help clients need so we can better support them or point them to other agencies.
